PeaceTogether: A Peaceful Pen Pal Art Project

In addition to old-fashioned letter writing, youth pen pals are invited to co-create a symbol of peace by decorating halves of a peace sign. Connected peace symbols will illustrate how collaboration, art and creativity can transcend barriers, fostering a deeper sense of connection.

Here's how it works:

- **STEP 1:** Both pen pals download and decorate both the <u>LEFT half</u> and the <u>RIGHT half</u> of the peace symbol.
- **STEP 2:** On the **LEFT half**, write their name/age/city/state/country in the <u>left</u> corner. On the **RIGHT half**, write their name/age/city/state/country in the <u>right</u> corner.
- STEP 3: Each pen pal sends the RIGHT half to their pen pal
- **STEP 4:** Each pen pal **keeps the LEFT half** that they decorated and *receives* the RIGHT half from their pen pal so that they can connect their halves and create a whole symbol to illustrate how they have become friends, united in peace.
- **STEP 5:** Take a picture using the guidelines below and upload it to **this link**. Kids for Peace will post it to the gallery on our Peaceful Pen Pals page.



Taking the Picture: □ Cut both halves of the peace symbol along the midline of the symbol □ Tape both halves of the peace symbol together, aligning the top and bottom of the circle □ Make sure the youth is holding the peace symbol as shown in the example to the left. □ Take the picture from the waste up in horizontal / landscape format, framing it so that there is space above the youth's head, on either side of their body and below the paper □ Ensure good lighting, avoiding windows or mirrors behind them □ Smile!
